#### Article 1

#### Armageddon and the Necessity of God's Organization

"While it was an agreeable surprise to us (in view of the contrary sensational accounts so often published) to find the situation in Europe as we describe it – in harmony with what the Scriptures have led us to expect – yet so great is our confidence in the word of God and in the light of the present truth shining upon it, that we could not have doubted its testimony whatever had been the appearances. The date of the close of that battle is definitely marked in Scripture as October, 1914. It is already in progress, its beginning dating from October, 1874. Thus far it has been chiefly a battle of words and a time of organizing forces – capital, labor, armies, and secret societies.

Never was there such a general time of banding together as at present. Not only are nations allying with each other for protection against other nations, but the various factions in every nation are organizing to protect their several interests. But as yet the various factions are merely studying the situation, testing the strength of their opponents, and seeking to perfect their plans and power for the future struggle, which many, without the Bible's testimony, seem to realize is the inevitable. Others still delude themselves, saying peace! Peace! When there is no possibility of peace until God's kingdom comes into control, compelling the doing of his will on earth as it is now done in heaven.

This feature of the battle must continue with varying success to all concerned; the organization must be very thorough; and the final struggle will be comparatively short, terrible and decisive – resulting in general anarchy. In many respects the convictions of the world's great generals coincide with the prediction of God's word. Then "woe to the man or nation who starts the next war in Europe; for it will be a war of extermination." It will be abetted not only by national animosities, but also by social grievances, ambitions and animosities, and if not brought to an end by the establishment of God's kingdom in the hands of his elect and then glorified church, it would exterminate the race – Matthew 24:22 Watchtower January 15, 1892 pages 21 through 23, reprint 1355"

"To our understanding the present war is pictured in the Bible, as due to begin in 1914. It is a great wind. In connection with that earthquake will come an exaltation of religious sects, Catholic and Protestant, on the side of the kings and princes – political, social, financial, religious. Tony Wills, the author of a historical study of Jehovah's Witnesses, wrote that Rutherford seemed to relish his descriptions of how completely the wicked would be destroyed at Armageddon, dwelling at great length on prophecies of destruction. He stated that towards the close of his ministry, Rutherford allocated about half the space that was available in *The Watchtower* magazines to discussions about Armageddon. "During the final period of the ancient world that perished in the Flood, Noah was a faithful preacher of righteousness. (2 Peter 2:5) In these last days of the present system of things, Jehovah's people are making known Gods righteous standards and are declaring good news about the possibility of surviving into the new world. Rarely does the Watchtower make such audacious statements; rather the destruction of nonwitnesses is conveyed (with unwavering regularity) by means of a number of more subtle concepts. The quotes that follow identify the preposterous claim that following the Bible is not enough for salvation, neither are belief in Jesus Ransom or living a moral life. Only submission to Jehovah's Watchtower Organization results in life. All Christians are considered members of Christendom and in line for destruction. Russell did not hold that view.

"We reasoned that, if Christ's coming was to end probation and bring irrevocable ruin upon ninety-nine in a hundred of mankind, then it could scarcely be considered desirable, neither could we pray with a proper spirit, "Come, Lord Jesus, Come quickly!"" <u>SUPPLEMENT TO</u> Zion's Watch Tower, And "Herald of Christ's Presence." July 1, 1879

"Russell wrote: "We felt greatly grieved at the error of Second Adventists, who were expecting Christ in the flesh, and teaching that the world and all in it except Second Adventists would be burned up."" *Proclaimers* p.45

It was during the leadership of Rutherford that this genocidal doctrine evolved, with the teachings of 'irrevocable ruin' and 'judgement periods' introduced, concepts Russell tried to avoid. In the *Watchtower* 1923 pp.310-311, it was shown that clergy would not be saved. In

1930, pp.275-281 Rutherford introduced that people who disagreed with him, apostates, would be in line for everlasting destruction. The *Watchtower* 1939 p.170 claimed those from prior judgement periods, such as Sodom and Gomorrah would not be in line for a resurrection; neither would Adam and Eve, Solomon or the Scribes and Pharisees. As to whether any new ones may be able to learn the truth and come over to God's side after the great tribulation begins, note Jesus' words recorded at Matthew 24:29-31. Do Jehovah's Witnesses really believe Jehovah will overseer the murder of innocent children at Armageddon? Following is a comment received by a friend of mine, after asking his parents to meet their grandchildren.

"I'm going to tell you the truth, you know how much I love little babies, but your Dad and I are not interested in getting to know your children AT ALL. We don't want to get to know them only to have to watch Jehovah God destroy them soon at Armageddon. That would just break our hearts. You know what you need to do if you want them to survive."

This is a comment I have seen many times, and is the raw truth of what Jehovah's Witnesses believe, even if they will say otherwise when questioned by the public. "Of this historical preview of Armageddon, the Bible says: "For just as the days of Noah were, so the presence of the Son of man will be. For as they were in those days before the flood, eating and drinking, men marrying and women being given in marriage, until the day that Noah entered into the ark; and they took no note until the flood came and swept them all away, so the presence of the Son of man will be." (Matthew 24:37-39) So the circumstances relating to the end of our world order at Armageddon will be similar to those associated with the ancient Deluge. They will be:

(1) The planet Earth and its animal life will survive;

(2) the significance of our times is missed by most people through preoccupation with the normal processes of life;

(3) the majority of mankind take no note of the divine warning of Armageddon; (4) hence **the majority of mankind will be destroyed** at Armageddon; and

(5) only a small minority of mankind will find favour with God and survive the "war of the great day of God the Almighty."" *From Kurukshetra to Armageddon - and Your Survival* pp.17-19

"To ensure their salvation, Noah and his family needed to exercise faith. This meant following instructions and the leadings of God's holy spirit. During the great tribulation, it will be just as imperative that we follow the leadings of the holy spirit and obey Jehovah's instructions through his organization." *Watchtower* 1991 Sep 15 p.17

"Really, our survival involves being devoted to Jehovah God and learning about the kind of conduct and deeds that please him. (Zephaniah 2:3) Rather than following the majority today and ignoring the clear signals that we are living in such important times, we need to "keep close in mind the presence of the day of Jehovah." Jehovah's Witnesses can show you from the Bible how you can be a survivor of this upcoming day." *Watchtower* 2015 May 1 p.8

"Today, events just as terrifying lie ahead, when this whole world system of things will be destroyed at Jehovah's hand. Still, escape is possible. The prophecy goes on to say: "It must occur that everyone who calls on the name of Jehovah will get away safe;... (Joel 2:32) Jehovah's Witnesses are truly grateful to know Jehovah's name, and they have complete trust that he will save them when they call on him." *Watchtower* 1998 May 1 p.19

This may appear logical when reading New World Translation Scriptural citations, but on becoming aware that the word Jehovah never appeared in the New Testament and has been falsely added into the New World Translation, this reasoning can be seen to be false.

The 2017 Watchtower image above says "A Great Crowd" will survive Armageddon. The Great Crowd refers to Jehovah's Witnesses alone. For instance, the Watchtower 2008 January study edition article "Counted Worthy to Be Guided to Fountains of Waters of Life" goes into great detail that makes clear this Great Crowd are part of the congregations of Jehovah's Witnesses.

The Watchtower 2012 February article "The Truth About Armageddon" says on page 7 that "The War of Armageddon results in the saving of millions of lives." Page 6 disingenuously says "The attack will result in the death of millions of people when God defeats the invaders." If millions will be saved, it would be honest to confess their teaching that billions, not millions, will die.

Whilst modern articles present the doctrine in the more positive light of the millions that survive, older issues were quite open in presenting the resultant conclusion that there will be billions that die.

"Why should not blood run deep and far with **over two billion** [the world population in 1955] dead?.... With the members of this generation that will not pass away before Armageddon breaks out numbering now two billion five hundred million and with **only the remnant** and a larger group of "**other sheep**" inside the Greater Noah's "ark" **surviving**, the

death toll of the "war of the great day of God the Almighty" will be appallingly allsurpassing, too many for the Armageddon survivors to bury. Come on, birds and beasts! Have your fill then from the human corpses in retribution for the wanton slaughter of animal and birdlife of which the human race has been guilty!" *You May Survive Armageddon Into God's New World* 1955 pp.341-342

"Yes, today, with Armageddon staring us in the face, we must keep in mind the sobering thought that millions, even **billions**, of lives may shortly come to a swift and decisive end, putting their onetime owners beyond the reach of any expression of love on our part." *Watchtower* 1965 Apr 1 p. 212

"What this means to us today is that those now living in this time of judgment and who fail for one reason or another to take a stand for Jehovah, and are therefore slain by him at the battle of Armageddon, will not be retained in his memory for a resurrection. That this group will include the **majority of humans now living** on earth is shown by Jeremiah 25:33: "The slain of the LORD shall be at that day from one end of the earth even unto the other end of the earth: they shall not be lamented, neither gathered, nor buried; they shall be dung..." *Watchtower* 1951 Jul 15 p.446

Should people live in fear of Armageddon? Consider what this horrific doctrine is based on. Armageddon is only mentioned once in the Bible at Revelation 16:16. In this vision, Armageddon is described as a war at the literal place of Megiddo. It is with great imagination that Watchtower leaders have expanded this to be a global war between God and mankind where billions die, leaving behind a smattering of Watchtower followers. This has come a long way from Watchtower's original teaching that Armageddon started in 1874 as a period of social upheaval. (See Zion's Watch Tower 1892 Jan 15 p.23)If you consider the great variance that this religion has been able to describe this one particular Scripture with, it should not credence should be given to their current interpretation. Paul Gundy, Salvation Only for Jehovah's Witnesses, JW Facts 2005 https://jwfacts.com/watchtower/salvationonly-for-jehovahs-witnesses.php, accessed April 16, 2022

If truth is easy to understand and God attracts his sheep, there is no excuse not to follow it. The flaw in this reasoning is that no Organization teaches absolute truth. Jehovah's Witnesses certainly do not teach it. In its short 140 year history, Watchtower has changed its teachings so substantially that they have no right to claim a unique ability to understand truth. It is illogical to state God gave Russell the many wrong teachings that the Watchtower later had to reject. "Where did we learn Bible truth in the first place? Would we know the way of the truth if it had not been for guidance from the organization? Really, can we get along without the direction of God's organization?" No, we cannot!" *Watchtower* 1983 Jan 15 p.27


Paradoxically, Armageddon will result in the eternal destruction of billions of "evildoers" that do not worship Jehovah, yet lead to the resurrection of billions of evildoers that did not worship Jehovah. The majority of both groups have never even heard of Jehovah, so what exactly is the difference between the two, what makes one group less deserving of life than the other? There is no overwhelming difference, other than an organization's attempt to grow its own membership. Jehovah's Witnesses are a classic example of this. Under Russell they believed that God would allow all to survive into Armageddon, but then when Rutherford introduced that most would die they blindly accepted what he said instead. Jehovah's Witnesses continue to go along with this offensive teaching, because the primary concern of people is their own salvation. ### **Salvation Only For Jehovah's Witnesses**

Watchtower teaches that Jehovah's Witnesses alone will survive Armageddon. This is because only they have God's backing, being the sole group that worship the true God, Jehovah.

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"**Only Jehovah's Witnesses**, those of the anointed remnant and the "great crowd," as a united organization under the protection of the Supreme Organizer, **have any Scriptural hope of surviving** the impending end of this doomed system dominated by Satan the Devil." <u>Watchtower 1989 Sep 1 p.19</u>

"In fact, with God's day of judgment so near today, all the world should 'keep silent before the Sovereign Lord Jehovah' and hear what he says through the "little flock" of Jesus' anointed followers and their companions, his "other sheep." (Luke 12:32; John 10:16) Annihilation awaits all who will not listen and who thereby set themselves against rule by God's Kingdom." *Watchtower* 2001 Feb 15 p. 14

I always struggled with this concept as one of Jehovah's Witnesses. The only reason I was a Witness was due to being "lucky" enough to have been raised one from infancy. Even in primary school I questioned why I would survive Armageddon whilst my classmates would die, when I was just doing what my parents told me to do, and they were doing as directed by their parents.

What sort of God could kill billions of people? When I discussed this with my father, who was a Circuit Overseer at the time, he said that Jehovah can read hearts and will save the righteous, regardless of their religion. I was certain that was not what Watchtower taught, and the official doctrine is that only Jehovah's Witnesses who are actively preaching when Armageddon arrives will be saved. The subsequent research I did to clarify Watchtower's offical stance forms the basis of this article.

This article is divided into the following sections:

- Historical development, showing *when* Watchtower introduced the concept of narrow salvation
- Watchtower quotes that only Jehovah's Witnesses will survive Armageddon
- Why this teaching is unfair and illogical

A constant flow of subtle concepts and direct Watchtower quotes indicate salvation at Armageddon is dependent on being an active Jehovah's Witness, associating with the Watchtower Organization.

"In effect, Jesus also conveys Jehovah's voice to us as he directs the congregation through "the faithful and discreet slave." (Matt. 24:45) We need to take this guidance and direction seriously, for our everlasting life depends on our obedience." <u>Watchtower 2014 Aug 15 p.21</u>

"During the final period of the ancient world that perished in the Flood, Noah was a faithful preacher of righteousness. (2 Peter 2:5) In these last days of the present system of things, Jehovah's people are making known Gods righteous standards and are declaring good news about the possibility of surviving into the new world. (2 Peter 3:9-13) Just as Noah and his God-fearing family were preserved in the ark, **survival of individuals today depends on** their faith and their loyal **association with the earthly part of Jehovah's universal organization**." <u>Watchtower **2006** May 15 p.22</u> "Are You Prepared for Survival?"

"Is it presumptuous of Jehovah's Witnesses to point out that **they alone have God's backing**? Actually, no more so than when the Israelites in Egypt claimed to have God's backing in spite of the Egyptians' belief, or when the first-century Christians claimed to have God's backing to the exclusion of Jewish religionists." <u>Watchtower 2001 Jun 1 p.16</u>

"Similarly, Jehovah is using **only one organization today** to accomplish his will. **To receive everlasting life** in the earthly Paradise we must identify that organization and serve God as part of it." <u>*Watchtower* 1983 Feb 15 p.12</u>

Their way of worship is said to be the only one acceptable when God searches for the few deserving of everlasting life.

"The Bible does not agree with the modern view that there are many acceptable ways to worship God. Ephesians 4:5 says there is "one Lord, one faith." Jesus stated: "Narrow is the gate and cramped the road leading off into life, and few are the ones finding it. ... Because Jehovah's Witnesses base all of their beliefs, their standards for conduct, and organizational procedures on the Bible, their faith in the Bible itself as God's Word gives them the conviction that what they have is indeed the truth. So their position is not egotistical..." *Reasoning from the Scriptures* pp.203-204

Watchtower goes as far as to state that there are *billions* in line for destruction.

"There are **billions** of people who do not know Jehovah. Many of them in ignorance practice things that God's Word shows to be wicked. If they persist in this course, they will be among those who **perish during the great tribulation**." *Watchtower* 1993 Oct 1 p.19

The *billions* slaughtered at Armageddon lose any hope of a resurrection; theirs is said to be an everlasting destruction.

"Yes, the **destruction** of the gross sinners in those cities was **eternal**, as will be the destruction of the wicked at the end of the present system of things." <u>Watchtower 1990 Apr</u> 15 p.20

"The majority of people living today will probably be alive when Armageddon breaks out, and there are no resurrection hopes for those that are destroyed then." <u>Kingdom Ministry</u> <u>1968 Mar p.4</u>

Rarely does the Watchtower make such audacious statements; rather the destruction of nonwitnesses is conveyed (with unwavering regularity) by means of a number of more subtle concepts. The quotes that follow identify the preposterous claim that following the Bible is not enough for salvation, neither are belief in Jesus Ransom or living a moral life. Only submission to Jehovah's Watchtower Organization results in life. All Christians are considered members of Christendom and in line for destruction.

#### Watchtower Development

Imagine for a second that Watchtower is not the true religion. As a Jehovah's Witness, do you think it would be fair that God is going to *destroy you*, because circumstances led you to being involved with the wrong religion?

Would a loving God be planning to devote billions of people to a violent and everlasting death? A God that is willing to slaughter 7 billion people is certainly not the God Russell described when starting the Bible Students. Russell left the Presbyterians because he could not believe in the injustice of a God willing to destroy the majority of humankind.

"We reasoned that, if Christ's coming was to end probation and bring irrevocable ruin upon ninety-nine in a hundred of mankind, then it could scarcely be considered desirable, neither could we pray with a proper spirit, "Come, Lord Jesus, Come quickly!"" <u>SUPPLEMENT TO</u> <u>Zion's Watch Tower, And "Herald of Christ's Presence." July 1, 1879</u>

Similarly, Russell could neither accept the salvation of only Adventists.

"Russell wrote: "We felt greatly grieved at the error of Second Adventists, who were expecting Christ in the flesh, and teaching that the world and all in it except Second Adventists would be burned up."" *Proclaimers* p.45

Under Russell, Watchtower used to teach that irrespective of religion, most people would survive Armageddon. His understanding on 'future probation' was that the masses of humanity would survive Armageddon and be educated on earth by Christ in the 1000-year reign, before receiving judgment. The resurrection was for all who have died, Adam included. Yet the religion he founded now claims even more than "ninety nine of a hundred will be destroyed." Globally there is only one Witness for every 1,000 people on earth. Therefore, on current statistics the Watchtower teaching is not that 99 out of 100 will be ruined, but rather Jehovah will eternally destroy 99.9 out of 100.

It was during the leadership of Rutherford that this genocidal doctrine evolved, with the teachings of 'irrevocable ruin' and 'judgement periods' introduced, concepts Russell tried to avoid. In the *Watchtower* 1923 pp.310-311, it was shown that clergy would not be saved. In 1930, pp.275-281 Rutherford introduced that people who disagreed with him, apostates, would be in line for everlasting destruction. The *Watchtower* 1939 p.170 claimed those from prior judgement periods, such as Sodom and Gomorrah would not be in line for a resurrection; neither would Adam and Eve, Solomon or the Scribes and Pharisees.

In 1941, when discussing the importance of being baptised, it was stated that everlasting life is dependant on being a "witness for Jehovah God."

"Therefore it follows that every person that receives the approval of Almighty God, and that receives from him life everlasting, *must be a witness for Jehovah God.*" <u>Consolation 1941</u> <u>Sep 17 p.12</u>

Later leaders have not attempted to soften the hard-line stance of Rutherford. Under the leadership of the third President, Nathan Knorr, it was published that 99.9% would die, a far cry from Russell's ideology that was critical of such elitist and manipulative assertions by religious leaders.


"As for humans upon earth, on the side of Jehovah will be all those fully dedicated to him and who are faithfully following Jesus Christ; compared with earth's **billions** these are indeed few. ... On Satan's side will be all the rest of mankind, more than **99.9 percent** ..." <u>Watchtower 1958 Oct 15 p.614</u>

Jehovah's Witnesses as still told that leaving the organization will result in everlasting death.

"... to leave Jehovah's organization ... we would lose not only the privilege of doing God's will but also the hope of life in God's new world." *Watchtower* 2016 Jun study ed p.26

Witnesses are expected to rejoice the destruction of mankind at Armageddon.

"In the near future this generation will see the foretold "great tribulation" that will bring an end to this present wicked system. (Matt. 24:21) At that time none of Jehovah's faithful servants, the only ones surviving, will mourn over the destruction of the wicked. To the contrary, they will rejoice, even as Moses and his people rejoiced at the destruction of Pharaoh and his army." *Watchtower* 1977 Jun 1 p.345



The Watchtower predicts that billions will die at Armageddon. If laid side by side, the corpses would reach the moon 7 times ... and growing.

In 1986, anyone disagreeing that God will destroy millions (or more accurately billions) was classed an opposer.


"Some opposers [are] entertaining ideas that God is so merciful that he surely will not cause the death of so many millions of people during the "great tribulation." <u>Watchtower 1986 Mar</u> <u>15 p.19</u>

The Watchtower feels it necessary to clarify that many would not flock to the organization with the start of the Great Tribulation.

"Any person who wants to survive into God's righteous new order urgently needs to come into a right relationship with Jehovah and His earthly organization *now*. ... Why is there such an urgency about coming to Jehovah's true worship now? Could not a sincere person wait until he actually sees Jehovah's executional judgments beginning, and then quickly come over to His side? While that might sound appealing to some, would there then be enough time to build the right relationship with Jehovah? The evidence from the Scriptures answers, No." *Watchtower* 1981 Nov 15 page 16, page 17

"The Watchtower of August 15, 1996, said: "In the final part of the tribulation, 'flesh' that has fled to Jehovah's side will be saved." Is that suggesting that after the first phase of the great tribulation, many new ones will come over to God's side? That was not the point being made. As to whether any new ones may be able to learn the truth and come over to God's side after the great tribulation begins, note Jesus' words recorded at Matthew 24:29-31. After the outbreak of the tribulation, the sign of the Son of man will appear. Jesus said that all the tribes of the earth will beat themselves and lament. He did not say anything about people waking up to the situation, repenting, taking God's side, and becoming true disciples. Similarly, in the parable of the sheep and the goats, the Son of man appears and judicially separates people on the basis of what they had done or not done in the past. Jesus said nothing about people who long displayed goatlike attributes suddenly turning around and becoming like sheep. He comes to judge on the basis of what people had already proved to be.-Matthew 25:31-46." *Watchtower* 1997 Feb 15 p.29

As part of their indoctrination, children are fed with graphic depictions of the slaughter they are led to believe God will shortly bestow upon fellow humans. This includes illustrations within books specially developed for Jehovah's Witness children. The following image of people running from Jesus' arrows, their faces distorted by absolute horror and fear, is from page 243 of the 2003 children's book, *Learn from the Great Teacher*.

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all the Prover 25:31 Notice in the following two articles the way a Witness is to deal with the question "Do Jehovah's witnesses believe that only they will be saved?" Stating that only Jehovah's Witnesses will be saved is to be avoided. It is recommended to say NO; even though the explanation given shows the answer is yes. After reading the whole paragraph, it is clear what is meant.

"Do they believe that they are the only ones who will be saved? No. Millions that have lived in centuries past and who were not Jehovah's Witnesses will come back in a resurrection and have an opportunity for life. Many now living may yet take a stand for truth and righteousness before the "great tribulation," and they will gain salvation." *Jehovah's Witnesses, Who are they? What do they believe?* (2002) p.29

"Do Jehovah's witnesses believe that only they will be saved?

Jehovah's witnesses believe that many will be saved who are not now Jehovah's witnesses. But with regard to the coming "great tribulation," and being saved through that conflict, the Bible shows that people must now turn to God and take their stand on his side if they wish protection from Him. Jesus said: "Just as the days of Noah were, so the presence of the Son of man will be. . . . they took no note until the flood came and swept them all away, so the presence of the Son of man will be." (Matt. 24:21, 37-39) Noah and his family, however, were saved through the Flood, because they served Jehovah God. All the others were destroyed. Jesus said that is what will happen at the coming "great tribulation," and this Jehovah's witnesses believe." *Watchtower* 1970 Apr 15 p.247

It needs to be noted that some individual Witnesses have internalised that salvation is not the exclusive domain of Jehovah's Witnesses. My father, a circuit overseer, was one of these. Others salve their conscience and sense of justice by saying that many will flock to God's Organization just before the end. The following quotes show that the Watchtower does not support such ideas, but distinctly teaches only its followers will be saved.

#### **Quotes and Watchtower Reasoning**

#### **Association with Jehovah's Organization**

The first line of reasoning is that you need to be associating with Jehovah's Organization. In order to identify which organization that is, the following quote makes clear the organization producing Watchtower literature is "Jehovah's organization."

"In Jehovah's organisation it is not necessary to spend a lot of time and energy in research, for there are brothers in the organisation who are assigned to that very thing, to help you who do not have so much time for this, these preparing the good material in *The Watchtower* and other publications of the Society." *Watchtower* 1967 Jun 1 p.338

Worshipping "Jehovah," and association with Jehovah's organization - the Watch Tower Society - is presented as essential for salvation.

"An even greater mistake would be to allow the faults of others to stumble us and cause us to leave Jehovah's organisation. Were that to happen, we would lose not only the privilege of doing God's will but also the hope of life in God's new world." <u>Watchtower 2016 Jun study</u> ed pp.26.27

"At that time, the lifesaving direction that we receive from Jehovah's organization may not appear practical from a human standpoint. All of us must be ready to obey any instructions we may receive, whether these appear sound from a strategic or human standpoint or not." *Watchtower* 2013 Nov 15 p.20

"If we stop actively supporting Jehovah's work, then we start following Satan. There is no middle ground." <u>*Watchtower* 2011 Jul 15 p.18</u>

"But Jehovah's servants already belong to the only organization that will survive the end of this wicked system of things." <u>Watchtower 2007 Dec 15 p.14</u>

"But if we were to draw away from Jehovah's organization, there would be no place else to go for salvation and true joy." <u>Watchtower 1993 Sep 15 p.22</u>

"Direct Interest Progressively on Bible Studies: The primary purpose of a Bible study is to teach the truth of God's Word. It should also build in the student an appreciation for Jehovah's organization and make him aware of the vital need to become part of it. ... The weekly Bible study should include instruction that will help students appreciate the organization and take advantage of provisions for their salvation. Take a few minutes each week to relate or describe something about the organization and how it functions. You can find helpful talking points in the November 1, 1984, *Watchtower*. The brochures *Jehovah's Witnesses in the Twentieth Century* and *Jehovah's Witnesses Unitedly Doing God's Will Worldwide* discuss major facets of the organization and how they may benefit us. Arranging for Bible students to view the video *Jehovah's Witnesses The Organization Behind the Name* will let them see for themselves what it is accomplishing." *Kingdom Ministry* 1993 Apr p.3

"They must appreciate that identifying themselves with Jehovah's organization is essential to their salvation." <u>*Kingdom Ministry* 1990 Nov p.1</u>

"**Only Christian witnesses of Jehovah** who successfully pass this test will survive and come forth like fire-refined gold for God's use in his precious new order." *Watchtower* 1975 Dec 15 p.753

"At this stage of the affairs of man, it is absolutely impossible for anyone, professed Christian or otherwise, to stand independently of the one organisation that is bearing witness worldwide to Jehovah, his goodness and supremacy in accord with the 145th Psalm and, in fact, in accord with all the Scriptures." *Yearbook* 1982 p.259

"And while now the witness yet includes the invitation to **come to Jehovah's organization for salvation**, the time no doubt will come when the message takes on a harder tone, like a "great war cry."" *Watchtower* 1981 Nov 15 p.21

"No matter where we may live on earth, God's Word continues to serve as a light to our path and a lamp to our roadway as to our conduct and beliefs. (Ps. 119:105) But Jehovah God has also provided his visible organization, his "faithful and discreet slave", made up of spiritanointed ones, to help Christians in all nations to understand and apply properly the Bible in their lives. Unless we are in touch with this channel of communication that God is using, we will not progress along the road to life, no matter how much Bible reading we do." *Watchtower* 1981 Dec 1 p.27

"This great crowd is part of the only truly united multinational organization on earth today. They do not cry out that they owe salvation to the holy spirit, for they are not servants of a trinitarian god. In some 200 geographical territories around the earth, they are at one in calling upon the name of Jehovah as they speak the one pure language of truth. (Zephaniah 3:9) Properly, they publicly acknowledge that their salvation comes from Jehovah, the God of salvation, through Jesus Christ, His Chief Agent of salvation.-Psalm 3:8; Hebrews 2:10. Modern technology has helped to make the loud voice of the united great crowd sound even louder. No other religious group on earth has need of publishing Bible study aids in more than 200 languages, since no other group is interested in reaching all peoples of earth with one united message." *Revelation* pp.122-123

To be considered one of Jehovah's Witnesses and part of the Organization requires reporting as an active *publisher*.

"As this spiritual warfare advanced, those serving with Jehovah's organization were refreshed by continuing flashes of Bible understanding, and their numbers grew until, in 1938, as many as 50,769 reported Kingdom service during an international testimony period." *Watchtower* 1984 Jan 1 p.11

The requirement of being a "publisher" to be counted as one of Jehovah's Witnesses is shown in legal documents, such as outlined in the following UK document from Nov 2020 regarding voting for congregation bylaws.

The related "Articles of Association And Bylaws" is even clearer that to be considered a congregation member requires one to "report ministerial activity to the Congregation."

#### ARTICLE VI-MEMBERS

The members of the Congregation shall be individuals who are full Almighty God, Jehovah, baptized as one of Jehovah's Witnesses, are complete with the doctrines and organizational arrangements set forth by the Governing Be ministerial activity to the Congregation. Anyone meeting these requirements why years of age shall be designated a voting member of the Congregation.

Memorial attendance or regular meeting attendance is not enough to quality as one of Jehovah's Witnesses.

"Moreover, the attendance at the Memorial of Jesus Christ's death last year indicates that some ten million people who are not Witnesses of Jehovah were sufficiently interested in the good news to attend this important commemoration." *Kingdom Ministry* 2008 Feb p.6


Through the use of very specific statistics, Watchtower leaves no doubt that you are only considered a Jehovah's Witness, part of Jehovah's Organization and in line for salvation if you report your preaching to Watchtower and attend their Kingdom Halls. The following figure of seven million is based on the 2007 publisher number. Likewise, the 69,000 congregations was the number of Jehovah's Witness congregations in 1993.

"Those who will form the nucleus of the "new earth", a new earthly society of rightly disposed people, are being gathered during these last days. They are already nearly seven million strong, in at least 235 lands and in some 100,000 congregations. These millions have been learning the righteous and just ways of Jehovah, and as a result, worldwide they enjoy a unity that is cemented by Christian love. Their unity is the most pronounced and enduring in the history of the world, a unity exceeding anything experienced by Satan's subjects." *Watchtower* 2007 Aug 15 p.26

"Today the Christian congregation is God's "house," "a pillar and support of the truth." (I Ti. 3:15) All the provisions for salvation are made available through this channel. For that reason, "to it all the nations must stream" if they desire to enjoy the blessings promised under God's Kingdom rule. - Isa. 2:2.

This "house comprises more than 69,000 congregations in 229 lands. ... It is urgent that people reach out to "draw close to God" by drawing closer to his organization." <u>*Kingdom Ministry*</u> 1993 Apr p.3

#### Children



Children are considered to share in the sins of their parents, so babies will die at Armageddon if their parents are considered unworthy of salvation.

"What will happen to young children at Armageddon? The Bible does not directly answer that question, and we are not the judges. However, the Bible does show that God views the young children of true Christians as "holy." (1 Cor. 7:14) It also reveals that in times past **when God destroyed the wicked he likewise destroyed their little ones**." *Reasoning from the Scriptures* pp.47-48

"Children are affected by the course of their parents, and parents are warned that their iniquity is visited on their offspring unto the third and fourth generation. (Ex. 20:5, 6) Parents

are commanded to instruct their children in God's way, and if in these last days parents refuse to heed the divine instruction and warning **they bring destruction upon themselves and their small children at Armageddon**. (Deut. 6:6, 7; Eph. 6:4) According to **justice God can leave such children dead**, for, as Ezekiel showed, all die in their iniquity." *Watchtower* 1950 Nov 15 p.463

"By all the evidences this system of things is hastening to its final confrontation with the God of justice at Armageddon. Parents and children who fail to gain the "mark on their foreheads," that is, an adequate appreciation of God's moral standard, are sure to suffer. Parents will be held accountable for their children, and **children will suffer for the failure of their parents**." *Watchtower* 1968 Feb 1 pp.83-84

Do Jehovah's Witnesses really believe Jehovah will overseer the murder of innocent children at Armageddon? Following is a comment received by a friend of mine, after asking his parents to meet their grandchildren.

"I'm going to tell you the truth, you know how much I love little babies, but your Dad and I are not interested in getting to know your children AT ALL. We don't want to get to know them only to have to watch Jehovah God destroy them soon at Armageddon. That would just break our hearts. You know what you need to do if you want them to survive."

This is a comment I have seen many times, and is the raw truth of what Jehovah's Witnesses believe, even if they will say otherwise when questioned by the public.

#### Preaching

Previous quotes showed that preaching is required to be considered a Jehovah's Witness. Watchtower has stated even more directly that preaching is a requirement for salvation.

 It helps save lives. ...
 It is a requirement for our own salvation." *Kingdom Ministry* 2012 Jun p.1 (US Edition)

"Giving this witness concerning God's kingdom to all the nations before the world's end comes at Armageddon is part of our being witnesses of Jehovah. ... Only the preachers of God's kingdom can expect to be protected during the end of this world and to live through Armageddon into the new world." *From Paradise Lost to Paradise Regained* (1958) p.249

#### Association with 144,000

Salvation comes from *association with and following* the "little flock", "the remnant of the 144,000", "the Anointed", "Spiritual Israelites", the "faithful and discreet slave," or more

importantly these days, "the Governing Body." These terms only refer to the small number of Jehovah's Witnesses that partake of the emblems at the annual Memorial.

But the prophet Daniel foretold that during the time of the end, "those having insight," the anointed remnant, would be "bringing the many to righteousness." (Read Daniel 12:3.) By their preaching and teaching work, they have brought millions of "other sheep" into a righteous standing before Jehovah. *Watchtower* 2016 Jul p.23

"He describes the sheep as "righteous" because they recognize that Christ has a group of anointed brothers still on earth, and the sheep loyally support the anointed during these critical last days. ... The illustration of the sheep and the goats shows that the anointed would have help. Therefore, one of the primary ways that those judged to be sheep show kindness to Christ's brothers is by supporting them in the preaching work." *Watchtower* 2015 Mar 15 p.27

"Although the ever-growing great crowd do not have the heavenly hope, they are proud to be associated with those who do. They have attached themselves to the Israel of God. By doing this, they are included among those whom Jehovah calls "my people."" *Watchtower* 2010 Mar 15 p.28

"That faithful slave is the channel through which Jesus is feeding his true followers in this time of the end. It is vital that we recognize the faithful slave. Our spiritual health and our relationship with God depend on this channel." *Watchtower* 2013 Jul 15 p.20

"We need to obey the faithful and discreet slave to have Jehovah's approval." *Watchtower* 2011 Jul 15 p.24 Simplified English Edition

"There would be "a great crowd" out of all nations who would not experience death but would have the prospect of living forever on earth. Are you among them?... The great crowd support the small number of those with heavenly hopes, who take the lead in the preaching work." *Worship the Only True God* (2002) pp.120,122

"But what must they do to survive the violent destruction of Satan's old world and enter the promised new world under the Greater Joshua, Jesus Christ? (2 Peter 3:13) They must keep in line with the organizational arrangements of the nucleus of Jehovah's visible organization, the anointed remnant." *Watchtower* 1989 Sep 1 p.15

"So the visible congregation of God's people has something to do with the provision of salvation today. Indeed, it has an important place in that provision. #### Those in Babylon will be Destroyed

Anyone part of any other religion, including Christendom, is part of Babylon the Great, and will not survive but "share in her plagues."


"That is not all there is to God's judgment against Babylon the Great. Her final destruction is soon to come. (Revelation 18:21) With good reason, the Bible urges people everywhere: "Get out of her [Babylon the Great] . . . if you do not want to share with her in her sins." (Revelation 18:4, 5) How do we get out of Babylon the Great? This involves more than just severing any ties with false religion. Babylonish influence is present in many popular celebrations and customs, in the world's permissive attitude toward sex, in the promoting of entertainment involving spiritism, and much more. To keep on the watch, it is vital that both in our actions and in the desires of our heart, we give evidence that we are truly separate from Babylon the Great in every way." *Watchtower* 2005 Oct 1 p.24

#### Goats will be destroyed

"The Devil is not on Jesus' side, and so the goatlike people who do nothing helpful to the reigning King Jesus Christ are against him and are on the Devil's side. There is no neutral side in the time of Christ's presence or parousia. They are cursed, just as Satan the Devil and his demon angels are. Hence, they deserve an everlasting future like that of the Devil and his angels." *God's Kingdom of a Thousand Years has Approached* p.286

"Similarly, in the parable of the sheep and the goats, the Son of man appears and judicially separates people on the basis of what they had done or not done in the past. Jesus said nothing about people who long displayed goatlike attributes suddenly turning around and becoming like sheep. #### Noah's Ark Represents Organization

The Watchtower teaches that just over 4,000 years ago there was a <u>global flood</u>, covering the top of every mountain with water. All human and animal life died, except for those within the ark. Noah's salvation in the ark represents baptism as part of Jehovah's organization and being part of Jehovah's organisation today is as critical for survival as it was to be in the ark in Noah's day.

"Do not conclude that there are different roads, or ways, that you can follow to gain life in God's new system. There is only one. There was just one ark that survived the Flood, not a number of boats. And there will be only one organization- God's visible organization - that will survive the fast-approaching "great tribulation." It is simply not true that all religions lead to the same goal ... You must be part of Jehovah's organization, doing God's will, in order to receive his blessing of everlasting life." *You Can Live Forever in Paradise on Earth* p.255

"Just as Noah was preserved through the Flood, loyal baptized ones will be preserved when the present wicked world meets its end. (Mark 13: 10; Rev. 7:9, 10) This makes dedication and baptism very important. A person who needlessly delays getting baptized endangers his prospects for everlasting life." *Watchtower* 2018 Mar p.3

"This "one baptism" applies to all who become true Christians. At baptism they become Christian Witnesses of Jehovah, God's ordained ministers.-Ephesians 4:5; 2 Corinthians 6:3, 4 Such baptism has great saving value in the eyes of God. For instance, after mentioning Noah's constructing of the ark, in which he and his family were preserved through the Flood, the apostle Peter wrote: "That which corresponds to this is also now saving you, namely, baptism, (not the putting away of the filth of the flesh, but the request made to God for a good conscience,) through the resurrection of Jesus Christ."" "Of this historical preview of Armageddon, the Bible says: "For just as the days of Noah were, so the presence of the Son of man will be. 
(1) The planet Earth and its animal life will survive;

"To ensure their salvation, Noah and his family needed to exercise faith. This meant following instructions and the leadings of God's holy spirit. During the great tribulation, it will be just as imperative that we follow the leadings of the holy spirit and obey Jehovah's instructions through his organization." *Watchtower* 1991 Sep 15 p.17

Should you fear that Noah's flood proves the majority of people will die at Armageddon? As discussed at <u>The Flood of Noah</u>, there was never a global flood, something proven by many lines of evidence. Watchtower's interpretation of a global flood is incorrect, and then used to scare people into joining that organization. When Peter discusses the Flood as representing baptism, he certainly didn't specify as a Jehovah's Witness, but rather as a follower of Jesus.

#### Word Jehovah Required

Worshipping specifically Jehovah God and using the word Jehovah is essential for salvation.

"Really, our survival involves being devoted to Jehovah God and learning about the kind of conduct and deeds that please him. (Zephaniah 2:3) Rather than following the majority today and ignoring the clear signals that we are living in such important times, we need to "keep close in mind the presence of the day of Jehovah." Jehovah's Witnesses can show you from the Bible how you can be a survivor of this upcoming day." *Watchtower* 2015 May 1 p.8

"Today, events just as terrifying lie ahead, when this whole world system of things will be destroyed at Jehovah's hand. Still, escape is possible. The prophecy goes on to say: "It must occur that everyone who calls on the name of Jehovah will get away safe;... (Joel 2:32) Jehovah's Witnesses are truly grateful to know Jehovah's name, and they have complete trust that he will save them when they call on him." *Watchtower* 1998 May 1 p.19

This may appear logical when reading *New World Translation* Scriptural citations, but on becoming aware that the word <u>Jehovah never appeared in the New Testament</u> and has been falsely added into the *New World Translation*, this reasoning can be seen to be false.

#### Armageddon

Armageddon is described as Jehovah's war with the world of mankind, in which billions will die, with Jehovah's Witnesses alone surviving.

The 2017 *Watchtower* image above says "A Great Crowd" will survive Armageddon. The Great Crowd refers to Jehovah's Witnesses alone. For instance, the *Watchtower* 2008 January study edition article "Counted Worthy to Be Guided to Fountains of Waters of Life" goes into great detail that makes clear this Great Crowd are part of the congregations of Jehovah's Witnesses.

The Watchtower 2012 February article "The Truth About Armageddon" says on page 7 that "The War of Armageddon results in the saving of millions of lives." Page 6 disingenuously says "The attack will result in the death of millions of people when God defeats the invaders." If millions will be saved, it would be honest to confess their teaching that billions, not millions, will die.

Whilst modern articles present the doctrine in the more positive light of the millions that survive, older issues were quite open in presenting the resultant conclusion that there will be billions that die.

"Why should not blood run deep and far with **over two billion** [the world population in 1955] dead?.... With the members of this generation that will not pass away before Armageddon breaks out numbering now two billion five hundred million and with **only the remnant** and a larger group of "**other sheep**" inside the Greater Noah's "ark" **surviving**, the death toll of the "war of the great day of God the Almighty" will be appallingly all-surpassing, too many for the Armageddon survivors to bury. Come on, birds and beasts! Have your fill then from the human corpses in retribution for the wanton slaughter of animal and birdlife of which the human race has been guilty!" *You May Survive Armageddon Into God's New World* 1955 pp.341-342

"Yes, today, with Armageddon staring us in the face, we must keep in mind the sobering thought that millions, even **billions**, of lives may shortly come to a swift and decisive end, putting their onetime owners beyond the reach of any expression of love on our part." *Watchtower* 1965 Apr 1 p. 212

"What this means to us today is that those now living in this time of judgment and who fail for one reason or another to take a stand for Jehovah, and are therefore slain by him at the battle of Armageddon, will not be retained in his memory for a resurrection. That this group will include the **majority of humans now living** on earth is shown by Jeremiah 25:33: "The slain of the LORD shall be at that day from one end of the earth even unto the other end of the earth: they shall not be lamented, neither gathered, nor buried; they shall be dung..." *Watchtower* 1951 Jul 15 p.446

Considering that Jehovah's Witnesses are probably the religion best know for using the fear of Armageddon to motivate its members, it is ironic that the 2012 *Watchtower* opens by saying "Although the word appears only once in the Bible, the term is repeated often by the news media and by religious leaders. ... the truth about Armageddon can free you from needless fear ..." (*Watchtower* 2012 Feb 1 p.3) This is the very edition that goes on the say that the only survivors of Armageddon will be the millions that belong to the brotherhood of Jehovah's Witnesses.

Should people live in fear of Armageddon? Consider what this horrific doctrine is based on. Armageddon is only mentioned once in the Bible at *Revelation* 16:16. In this vision, Armageddon is described as a war at the literal place of Megiddo. It is with great imagination that Watchtower leaders have expanded this to be a global war between God and mankind where billions die, leaving behind a smattering of Watchtower followers. This has come a long way from Watchtower's original teaching that Armageddon started in 1874 as a period of social upheaval. (See *Zion's Watch Tower* 1892 Jan 15 p.23)If you consider the great variance that this religion has been able to describe this one particular Scripture with, it should not credence should be given to their current interpretation.

### Is This Doctrine Fair?

Jesus was born in the Middle East, where Christianity was founded. Watchtower on the other hand is an American religion, founded in America, headquartered in America, with a predominantly white male Governing Body. Its depictions of Armageddon include American solders, as identified by their camouflage and M16 assault rifles.

There are 12 classical world religions and over 34,000 Christian sects III. Religious leaders commonly say that salvation requires following their particular God. Extremist groups go even further and insist that belonging to their particular sect is a requirement for salvation. Is this a fair conclusion?

The religion a person belongs to is overwhelmingly connected to the situation of one's birth.

"What religion a man shall have is a historical accident, quite as much as what language he shall speak." George Santayana '*Life of Reason' - Volume 'Reason in Religion'* p.5

"Isn't it a remarkable coincidence that almost everyone has the same religion as their parents? And it always just happens to be the right religion." — Richard Dawkins If you are a Watchtower follower, imagine for a second that Jehovah's Witnesses do not represent the true religion. Do you think it fair that God is going to destroy you for being part of the wrong religion? As the Watchtower discourages active examination of other beliefs, would it be fair that you will shortly die for not finding the correct one?

Is the teenage Jehovah's Witness in the United States of America that listens to immoral "pop" music more righteous than the Baptist missionary in Indonesia? Should the Nepalese monk, isolated from the world and Bible be destroyed for living the life of abstinence that he truly believed and was indoctrinated to understand was the way to achieve oneness with God?


An experience from a Jehovah's Witness sent to China to engage in Watchtower's Missionary service highlights just how unsound it is to think people of other cultures are worthy of destruction.

"Sooner or later, in our study sessions, my students and I would get to the section in the book with the chapter on Armageddon—with its two-page centerfold illustration of fire falling from the sky and people dying, reeling into the gaping earth. As I began to explain these things, in a new tongue, in a new place, I started to hear what I was saying, for the first time: "So because you were born here, and I was born into my world, God's going to kill you and your family and friends and associates, but not me. Because you were educated differently, in a different culture, and therefore have a different explanation for life, for spirituality, for goodness, for meaning, you will die, and I will live. This is because I was taught, week in, week out, from the time I was five, that this all made perfect sense. And you were not." (Open book to Armageddon centerfold.)

I started to feel embarrassed."

When a religion teaches absolute truth, it may make sense anyone not believing this truth is worshipping falsehood. Anyone not worshipping Jehovah is worshipping Satan, and so deserves destruction. This would only be fair if this truth was consistent and accessible. If truth is easy to understand and God attracts his sheep, there is no excuse not to follow it. The flaw in this reasoning is that no Organization teaches absolute truth. Jehovah's Witnesses certainly do not teach it. In its short 140 year history, Watchtower has changed its teachings so substantially that they have no right to claim a unique ability to understand truth. It is illogical to state God gave Russell the many wrong teachings that the Watchtower later had to reject.



In Bible times, God indicated whom he was using through powerful signs. He spoke directly to Abraham and provided powerful miracles through Moses. First century Christians witnessed God personally speaking in approval of his son and watched Jesus heal the sick and raise the dead. The apostles and other Christians continued to display such powerful works. Jehovah's Witnesses have never produced a powerful sign of any kind to assist identify their Organization as approved today.

The problem with saying salvation is dependent on belonging to a single, small organization is reality proves that the Watchtower is not accessible to a large portion of the world. Much of the world does not even have access to the Bible.

The following map shows that over half the world is not Christian, and by and large the chance of being a Jehovah's Witnesses is dependent on living in a country that was conquered or converted by Christianity over the last 2,000 years.

Being a Witness is predominantly contingent on where one is born and billions of people will never hear of the name Jehovah or Jesus. Living within the following countries - Bangladesh, Cambodia, China, India, Mali, Nepal, Niger, Pakistan, Thailand and Turkey are around 3 billion people, nearly half the global population. Yet the 2006 Watchtower Service Report showed that combined these have less than 40,000 Witnesses, not even 1 for every 70,000 people. These countries represent many religious (Muslim, Atheist, Buddhist and Hindu) and ethnic (African, Indian, Asian and European) backgrounds, showing that no particular group is genetically disposed to be "goat-like". In Pakistan and Bangladesh virtually all will be destroyed, the ratio of Witnesses to 'worldly people' is less than 1:1,000,000. In 2006, there was not a single Witness in Afghanistan. Is it fair for people who have never even heard of Jehovah to be destroyed at Armageddon?

The 2011 Publisher report lists countries where Witnesses are banned under the category "30 Other Lands". Highlighted in red, these make up 16% of the earth's land surface, and account for 1.9 billion people, or 27% of the earth's population. Despite the size of this group, there were only 24,483 Jehovah's Witness publishers across these countries combined, which is less than 1 in every 77,000 people.

People of other religions are as devoted as Jehovah's Witnesses. "Kumbh Mela" is a Hindu pilgrimage to bathe in a sacred river, attended by 100 million people in 2013. By far the majority of these will never hear about Jesus, let alone Jehovah's Witnesses.



Even in Christian countries, it is illogical for God to destroy people for understanding the Bible in a manner that differs to that described by the Watchtower. A person reading the Bible without the aid of a Watchtower will never arrive at current Watchtower truth.

"Where did we learn Bible truth in the first place? Would we know the way of the truth if it had not been for guidance from the organization? Really, can we get along without the direction of God's organization?" No, we cannot!" *Watchtower* 1983 Jan 15 p.27

To believe God would only find people of a single religion acceptable, regardless of size, does not seem fair.

Only a small percentage of people convert to other religions and there is no single destination for converters. Their choice is the one they stumble upon at just the right moment in time, a matter of time and unforeseen circumstance. A 2001 ARIS survey shows that 84% of American adults retain the one religion for life. Of the 16% that leave, the largest group leave all religion. "Some groups such as Mormons and Jehovah's Witnesses appear to attract a large number of converts (in-switchers), but also nearly as large a number of apostates (out-switchers)." (See <u>2001 ARIS survey</u>page 24)

Jehovah's Witnesses reported over 2 billion hours preaching in 2017, yet members increased by little over 100,000, of which many were likely raised within that religion. Changing a person from the religion of their upbringing is no easy task.

On September 11<sup>th</sup> 2001, people watched in horror as the twin towers in New York collapsed, killing several thousand people over a disagreement of religious ideologies. Yet this is inconsequential when compared to the destruction Jehovah is expected to mete upon humankind, billions of which have never seen a Bible. If the senseless death of a few thousand people offends a person's sense of justice, how much more so should the global slaughter described by Watchtower and eagerly awaited by Jehovah's Witnesses?

Paradoxically, Armageddon will result in the eternal destruction of billions of "evildoers" that do not worship Jehovah, yet lead to the resurrection of billions of evildoers that did not worship Jehovah. The majority of both groups have never even heard of Jehovah, so what exactly is the difference between the two, what makes one group less deserving of life than the other? There is no overwhelming difference, other than an organisation's attempt to grow its own membership.

"If we'd been born where they were born and taught what they were taught, we would believe what they believe."

With illogical conceit, members of many religions believe they alone belong to the only true faith. Do these members believe that, endowed with luck they stumbled upon - or were born into - the Truth? Do they possess a more intelligent or perceptive mind? Is their heart condition so superior to all others that God and his angels directed them to the only true religion? The root of such reasoning lies with the pride of religious leaders that prey on the gullibility of naive followers; followers who are content to accept that there are many routes to salvation if so told, but just as willing to believe that they alone deserve salvation.

Jehovah's Witnesses are a classic example of this. Under Russell they believed that God would allow all to survive into Armageddon, but then when Rutherford introduced that most would die they blindly accepted what he said instead. Jehovah's Witnesses continue to go along with this offensive teaching, because the primary concern of people is their own salvation.

#### Armageddon and the Necessity of God's Organization

Russell did not hold that view.

1879 "We reasoned that, if Christ's coming was to end probation and bring irrevocable ruin upon ninety-nine in a hundred of mankind, then it could scarcely be considered desirable, neither could we pray with a proper spirit, "Come, Lord Jesus, Come quickly!"" <u>SUPPLEMENT TO</u> <u>Zion's Watch Tower, And "Herald of Christ's Presence." July 1, 1879</u>

1892 "While it was an agreeable surprise to us (in view of the contrary sensational accounts so often published) to find the situation in Europe as we describe it – in harmony with what the Scriptures have led us to expect – yet so great is our confidence in the word of God and in the light of the present truth shining upon it, that we could not have doubted its testimony whatever had been the appearances. The date of the close of that battle is definitely marked in Scripture as October, 1914. It is already in progress, its beginning dating from October, 1874. Thus far it has been chiefly a battle of words and a time of organizing forces – capital, labor, armies, and secret societies.

Never was there such a general time of banding together as at present. Not only are nations allying with each other for protection against other nations, but the various factions in every nation are organizing to protect their several interests. But as yet the various factions are merely studying the situation, testing the strength of their opponents, and seeking to perfect their plans and power for the future struggle, which many, without the Bible's testimony, seem to realize is the inevitable. Others still delude themselves, saying peace! Peace! When there is no possibility of peace until God's kingdom comes into control, compelling the doing of his will on earth as it is now done in heaven.

This feature of the battle must continue with varying success to all concerned; the organization must be very thorough; and the final struggle will be comparatively short, terrible and decisive – resulting in general anarchy. In many respects the convictions of the world's great generals coincide with the prediction of God's word. Then "woe to the man or nation who starts the next war in Europe; for it will be a war of extermination." It will be abetted not only by national animosities, but also by social grievances, ambitions and animosities, and if not brought to an end by the establishment of God's kingdom in the hands of his elect and then glorified church, it would exterminate the race – Matthew 24:22 Watchtower January 15, 1892 pages 21 through 23, reprint 1355"

1915 "To our understanding the present war is pictured in the Bible, as due to begin in 1914. It is a great wind. Following the great war, the Bible teaches, a great earthquake – social revolution will take place. #### **ARTICLE 4**

#### Armageddon and the Necessity of God's Organization

Russell did not hold that view.

1879 "We reasoned that, if Christ's coming was to end probation and bring irrevocable ruin upon ninety-nine in a hundred of mankind, then it could scarcely be considered desirable, neither could we pray with a proper spirit, "Come, Lord Jesus, Come quickly!"" <u>SUPPLEMENT TO</u> Zion's Watch Tower, And "Herald of Christ's Presence." Never was there such a general time of banding together as at present. Not only are nations allying with each other for protection against other nations, but the various factions in every nation are organizing to protect their several interests. But as yet the various factions are merely studying the situation, testing the strength of their opponents, and seeking to perfect their plans and power for the future struggle, which many, without the Bible's testimony, seem to realize is the inevitable. Others still delude themselves, saying peace! Peace! When there is no possibility of peace until God's kingdom comes into control, compelling the doing of his will on earth as it is now done in heaven.

This feature of the battle must continue with varying success to all concerned; the organization must be very thorough; and the final struggle will be comparatively short, terrible and decisive – resulting in general anarchy. In many respects the convictions of the world's great generals coincide with the prediction of God's word. Then "woe to the man or nation who starts the next war in Europe; for it will be a war of extermination." It will be abetted not only by national animosities, but also by social grievances, ambitions and animosities, and if not brought to an end by the establishment of God's kingdom in the hands of his elect and then glorified church, it would exterminate the race – Matthew 24:22 Watchtower January 15, 1892 pages 21 through 23, reprint 1355"

"I'm going to tell you the truth, you know how much I love little babies, but your Dad and I are not interested in getting to know your children AT ALL. We don't want to get to know them only to have to watch Jehovah God destroy them soon at Armageddon. That would just break our hearts. You know what you need to do if you want them to survive."

Whilst modern articles present the doctrine in the more positive light of the millions that survive, older issues were quite open in presenting the resultant conclusion that there will be billions that die.

#### ARTICLE 5

Randy McCracken writes in an article about Armageddon, "Could the Equation of Armageddon with Mountain of Megiddo Be Wrong?

In his recent book <u>*The Unseen Realm*</u>, Bible scholar <u>Michael Heiser</u> argues that Armageddon should be equated with Jerusalem, not Megiddo. (If Heiser is correct, this means I need to revise one of my statements in my post entitled: <u>Tel-Megiddo</u>!) Heiser makes the following points to advance his argument:

- 1. Megiddo is a *tell*, it is not a mountain.
- Zechariah 12:9-11 pictures Jerusalem as the place where the final battle against the nations will take place. Interestingly, Megiddo is also mentioned in this passage. Heiser states, "It is crystal clear that *the final conflict occurs at Jerusalem, not Megiddo*. Megiddo is referenced only to compare the awful mourning that will result." He continues by also noting, "verse 11 tells us explicitly that *Megiddo is a plain, not a mountain*!" (p. 370, all italics are the author's).
- 3. Heiser's third point is more complicated and involves knowing a little Hebrew as he attempts to show that the word "magedon" does not come from Armageddon, but from a different Hebrew expression. He points out that there are 2 letters in the Hebrew alphabet that are transliterated with a "g" in Greek and English. Transliteration means writing the letters of another alphabet in the equivalent forms of our alphabet. One of those letters is the Hebrew letter 'avin (v). An 'avin is pronounced in the back of the throat like a hard "g" but it is represented in English transliteration as a backwards apostrophe ('). Heiser notes that the transliteration of the city Gomorrah is 'amorah. I would add, the same is true for the city Gaza which also begins with an 'ayin and is transliterated as 'aza. If the letter "g" in "magedon" is an 'ayin, then, Heiser argues, that the Hebrew expression would be har mo'ed which means "mountain of assembly." If you're unfamiliar with Hebrew, I know that going from "Armageddon" to "har mo'ed" seems like a stretch. But trust me, it works. Heiser notes that this expression is found in <u>Isaiah 14:13</u>. This is a passage usually attributed to Satan's defiance of God and Heiser treats it fully elsewhere in his book. To fully appreciate his point, it is necessary to read the book. For the full argument on this particular point see pages 370-373.
- 4. "Jerusalem is a mountain–Mount Zion" (p. 373). Heiser's point is that when John uses the word Armageddon, he is meaning the mountain of assembly which every one who knew Hebrew would equate with Mount Zion, or Jerusalem.

#### Megiddo or Jerusalem?

Since David conquered Jerusalem 3,000 years ago, it has been the center and hearbeat of Israelite life. Something rings true to me about the final battle taking place in Jerusalem. After all, even today, Jerusalem remains the focal point of controversy and contention when it comes to the Middle East. Even if it can't be proven that Armageddon means "mountain of the assembly," Heiser's other arguments make sense of an important biblical event that all Christians long to see

#### ARTICLE 6

God has told me the time is short. Armageddon is here. If you wish to find redemption you must hear me. God is setting apart a remnant and now is the time to make a decision. I have much teaching you need to hear. Listen now, save yourself and your children. It will be too late if you turn away. Don't let your family suffer. I have been sent by the Holy Spirit and truly represent God. Listen!!!

So, would you listen to me if I came to you with the above warning? Would you follow me and surrender your time and money? Perhaps some would. (See me later). But the majority would likely sigh and wonder what this is about. Too much free time? Sleep deprivation? Off medications again? Perhaps a troll? Most of you would want to see some evidence beyond the "I say it is true and I am God's representative". And for those of you who aren't impressed enough to fall in line, congratulations, you have critical thinking skills. However, for the JW loyalist among us, if you need to see proof to follow me, why would you take the below information and accept it uncritically? There are literally dozens of verses telling you that if you do not follow the Watchtower you will perish. You may even lose the opportunity of future resurrection. Read the passage below. Where is the proof? What actual tangible proof has the WT ever shown that it is indeed God's organization on earth? Other than "they" say it is true, what do they offer?

"Any person who wants to survive into God's righteous new order urgently needs to come into a right relationship with Jehovah and His earthly organization now. ... Why is there such an urgency about coming to Jehovah's true worship now? Could not a sincere person wait until he actually sees Jehovah's executional judgments beginning, and then quickly come over to His side? While that might sound appealing to some, would there then be enough time to build the right relationship with Jehovah? The evidence from the Scriptures answers, No." Watchtower 1981 Nov 15 page 16-17.

#### ARTICLE 7

Living in fear of Armageddon? I may have some good news for you. I am aware that even among those who have "Left Jehovah" there remains a lingering fear of perishing at Armageddon. Please stop. It is a wasted worry, at least the way the WT presents it. Their teaching is annoying, like Gecko poop and snail slime, but ultimately devoid of real significance.

Remember Charles Taze Russell the original and beloved leader of the Bible Students? (They ultimately went on to became the Jehovah's Witnesses.) Were you aware that he wrote about Armageddon as early as 1892? He developed the basic doctrines and theology of the Watchtower. His theology permeates the Witnesses except when it doesn't. It seems that he believed that Armageddon began in 1874 and would end in October of 1914. Now, rather than plunge into the icy cold waters of failed prophecy there is another point I want to make. Russell was appalled that current religious groups (Presbyterians and Second Adventists) would state that only their adherents would go to heaven. He was opposed to the idea of hell or judgement and expected everyone to be resurrected at the end of things. Adam and Eve, those from Sodom and Gomorrah, used car salesmen, the entire lot would all be raised in the end and would get another chance. In his own way, he was a kind man who believed in a modified universalism. When he wrote of Armageddon, he viewed it as societal conflict that would end in anarchy, at which point the true church (guess who) would step in and redeem the situation. No dead bodies strewn about, no birds with indigestion. Just a restoration of things. A new order. This view prevailed until the 1930s when Judge Rutherford, having secured his position, began changing doctrine. The Judge was big into battles and judgment and by the time he was in full swing it is estimated that half of his material was related in some way to Armageddon. The Judge was a guy in need of an intervention and not someone who should have been developing doctrine for people. But he did. He made the WT central to salvation. The theme became "follow me/us" and "if you don't belong to the WT you will be slain and never resurrected". Over the years dozens of articles were written with passages making salvation dependent on belonging to "God's organization on earth" and working like a dog. This is the antithesis of what Russel believed. Seriously, there is no evidence God ever chose that sad group of people to lead anything. I grant you it's an organization and they are good at publishing but it's pretty clear that everything they touch eventually turns to sludge. I don't know about you but the last place I would look for life advice would from a cart lady. Anyway, forget their bad teaching and abysmal theology.
