You said, "In the resurrection we make a new start for 1000 yrs. In that time on the end of 1000 yrs there will be a judgment as you mentioned. John 5: 29 those who did good things to a resurrection of life, and those who practiced vile things to a resurrection of judgment."

Let's look at this claim in light of Scripture. First of all, Hebrews 9:27-28 says, "27 And just as it is appointed for mortals to die once, and after that the judgment, 28 so Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin, but to save those who are eagerly waiting for him. Notice the sequence. Men die and then the judgement occurs. Jesus appears then, not to deal with any sin that might occur during the supposed 1000year probation period, but to save those who have turned to him. If we then look at Revelation 20 we see that there is an initial resurrection of those who have been martyred for their faith. They will rule and reign with Christ for 1000 years. Then after that there will be a rebellion. When the rebellion is quelled there will come a time of judgment and the resurrection of all mankind. Nowhere is there a time sequence that matches the WT understanding of the end nor is there any time for a 1000-year probation period. The John 5 passage follows the defeat of Satan and represents the judgment or reward of those who lived between Adam and the last living human. If you disagree, help me to see your point of view.
